Here's an easy easy one for you! It has a bit of a Southwestern flair done in Coral and Sand, as I have here, but it also makes a wonderful Scrap Quilt!

It's a 12" block!

## ** Preparing the Pieces and Sewing the Block **



First cut the Color $13-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 7$ " strip into two $3-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ squares...

Now speed piece the small half squares, by stacking the Color 1 and Color $23-7 / 8^{\prime \prime} \times 7-3 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ strips right sides together. On the
 back of the top strip lightly mark the $3-7 / 8^{\prime \prime}$ square line and the diagonals. Sew $1 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ above and below the marked diagonals, pivoting at the square line. Cut apart ON the marked diagonals, and on the square line. This will give you four half squares. Press seam allowances towards the darker fabric. These should measure 3-1/2" ...


Sew the first and second units we just made together along the bottom edge, again using a $1 / 4$ " seam. Press seam allowance towards the bottom unit. Make two of these units...

## Anvil - Page 2



Now piece the block. Sew each of the two large half squares to a corner unit. Alternate pressing directions...and that's all there is to it!


The quilt is a simple four blocks by five blocks, with a thin border in olive, which I pulled from the main fabric, then a slightly wider coral border, and is finished off in Prairie Points...

Color Color 2 needs: one $6-7 / 8^{\prime \prime}$ square AND one $3-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 7$ " strip AND one 32 7/8" x 7-3/4 strip
