# Baby Four-Patch Block

Skill Level CONFIDENT BEGINNER

Finished Size 12" x 12"

#### **Cutting Instructions**

(1/4" seam allowance included in measurements)

## Background - Fabric 1

- ... Piece A ... Cut 12 rectangles 2" x 3 1/2"
- ... Piece B ... Cut 4 squares 2" x 2"
- ... Piece C ... Cut 8 squares 2 3/8"
- ... Piece D ... Cut 1 square 3 1/2" x 3 1/2" Pink Solid –

#### Fabric 2

- ... Piece B ... Cut 4 squares 2" x 2"
- ... Piece C ... Cut 2 squares 2 3/8" x 2 3/8"

#### Pink Print – Fabric 3

### Blue Print - Fabric 5

... Piece D ... Cut 1 square 3 1/2" x 3 1/2"

#### Yellow Solid - Fabric 6

- ... Piece B ... Cut 4 squares 2" x 2"
- ... Piece C ... Cut 2 squares 2 3/8" x 2 3/8"

#### Yellow Print – Fabric 7

... Piece D ... Cut 1 square 3 1/2" x 3 1/2"

... Piece D ... Cut 1 square 3 1/2" x 3 1/2"

Blue Solid – Fabric 4

... Piece B ... Cut 4 squares 2" x 2"

... Piece C ... Cut 2 squares 2 3/8" x 2 3/8"

#### Green Solid - Fabric 8

... Piece B ... Cut 4 squares 2" x 2"

... Piece C ... Cut 2 squares 2 3/8" x 2 3/8"

#### **Green Print – Fabric 9**

... Piece D ... Cut 1 square 3 1/2" x 3 1/2"

#### **Sub Unit Assembly**

Pieced Square: On wrong side of lightest fabric, draw diagonal line using marking tool of your choice. Sew 1/4" seam on each side of marked line; cut apart on marked line. Press open to make pieced squares. (Diagram 1)



Flying Geese Unit: Refer to Diagram 2 when assembling Flying Geese units.


