








Strip quilt with checkerboard

Quilt finishes 38.5 x 45

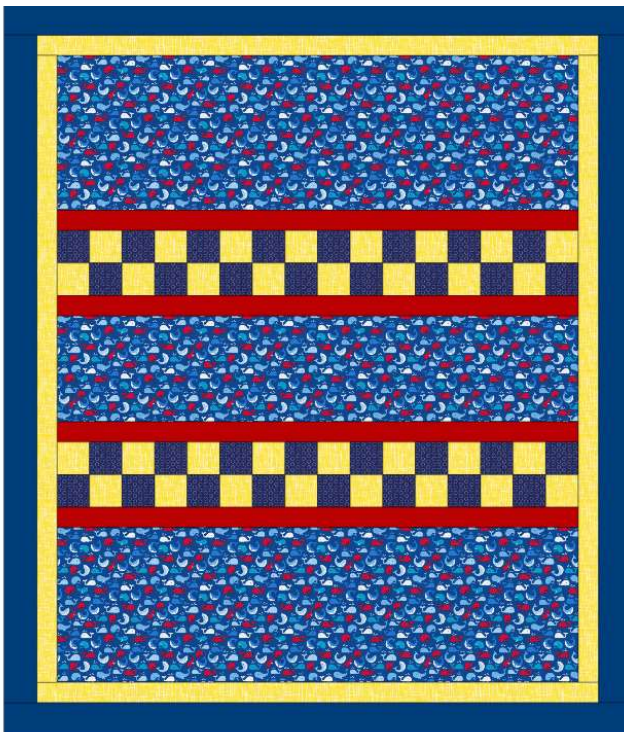
Center layout finishes 32 x 38.5

This is good for a really big print that would look too broken up if cut into small pieces. For example, we used it with trucks going across the panel.

CUT

- Big print – cut 2 strips 32.5 x 10 and 1 strip 32.5" x 7
- Red -strips beside checkerboard cut 4 32.5 x 1.75
- Blue-checkerboard squares -cut 2 Width of Fabric strips 2.5 inches wide
- Yellow- checkerboard squares cut 2 Width of fabric strips 2.5 inches wide and for inner border cut 2 @35 x 1.75 and 2 @ 39 x 1.75
- Blue -outside border cut 2 strips 39. x 2.5 and 2 strips 41.5 x 2.5



For checkerboard: Sew each blue 2.5 inch wide strip to a yellow 2.5 inch wide strip. Press and cut across both colors into 2.5 inch widths. You should get 16 from each blue and yellow strip.



Alternate directions and sew 16 of these together into a checkerboard strip.

Sew Red strips to each long side of checkerboard strip.

Sew to large print pieces, putting narrower strip in the middle.

Add yellow border. The longer strips are vertical and should be sewn on first.

Add outer blue border. The longer strips are vertical and should be sewn on first
